

Payday Super from 1 July 2026

What this means for you and what you need to do



Superannuation will now be paid at the same time as your pay. It will take a few days for the super payment to be allocated to your superannuation fund, but you will notice the change in frequency which will enable your superannuation to be invested earlier than had been the case.

When your super is paid, it is subject to very tight deadlines with penalties for missing those deadlines. You can help out by keeping your employer informed of changes.

Keep your details up to date

Make sure your super details are accurate. Ensure you have your superannuation fund details handy, including your member number and the Unique Superannuation Identifier (USI) of your fund.

Inform your employer if:

- ✓ You change super funds
- ✓ Your fund is closing or merging
- ✓ Your Self Managed Super Fund cannot accept contributions

What happens if your details are wrong?

If your superannuation contribution is rejected, your super may be sent to a default superannuation fund instead. You'll need to go through a process to move those funds to your intended superannuation fund.
